THE SACRED TRIDUUM

From Sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period is referred to as the *Easter Triduum*, also known as the *Sacred Triduum*, or *Paschal Triduum*. The word 'triduum' comes from the Latin word triduum, which comes from *tris* (three) = *dies* (day). Basically, the Sacred Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins.

The evening Mass on **Holy Thursday** is referred to as *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*. This is where the Church relives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified...and the humble manner of leadership in the washing of the feet

Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. This is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world. The parish altar looks very different on Good Friday: It is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the tabernacle at the main altar of the church; it is carried away on Holy Thursday evening to the altar of repose to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the tabernacle is blown out, and the tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. This is quite dramatic, reminding us that Good Friday is a solemn day of mourning and prayer.

On Holy Saturday Christ is in the tomb. There is no morning Mass.
